

At the Christmas Conference of 1923/24 Rudolf Steiner re-founded the Anthroposophical Society. In an act of profound esoteric significance, he created a seed-like social form with the potential to provide an effective stimulus for cultural renewal. In the lectures on karmic relations given in 1924, Steiner gave Society members deep insights into karma of the Society, looking into the past and the future. He explained the Society has the potential to bring together two great mystery streams that must learn to work in intimate harmony if anthroposophy is to fulfill its historic mission. In European cultural history these streams appeared as the Platonists and the Aristotelians. Only through combining their forces in the creative container of the Society and the broader movement will these streams find the power to win Cosmic Intelligence back from the dragon of materialism and open a path to cultural renewal based on knowledge of the spirit.
