Course Description

“The good and the bad, the beautiful and the ugly “

Using water colour we will explore The Grimm fairy tale of Snow White and Rose Red, how it relates to our own soul and how it offers us a way of meeting the many challenges we might face in our present age. We will explore the meaning of the Bear and Dwarf as important archetypes for renewal and growth.

We will also look for inspiration in the story of Percival in whom innocence and purity form a strong part of his soul. Parzival is a story depicting the struggle between moral actions, which lead us to greater freedom, and immoral actions, which fetter freedom, and tend to destroy vs create.

Donald runs the “Freie Malschule Bozen, a painting school in Italy and teaches monthly courses in Rome, Milan, and Croatia.

Join us for an evening presentation of **Anthroposophical water colour painting technique** within the context of art history, August 7 at 7 pm in the Halifax Central Library, Aug 8th in Wolfville at the Al Whittle Theatre, and Aug 10th in Blockhouse at the South Shore Waldorf School.
