On a crisp and sunny May morning, an expectant audience had gathered at the Glenora Farm Camphill Community, to hear Richard Steel, CEO of the Karl König Institute, Berlin, speak about König's work with the Calendar of the Soul.

Richard took us on a journey through König's biography and the story of the creation of the 52 drawings which try to capture the essence of each of the weekly verses.

Karl König created the whole cycle of drawings in a short amount of time, while he was detained on the Isle of Man as a Jewish refugee from Germany.


König had immersed himself deeply into the verses of the Calendar of the Soul which are not to be understood as a linear sequence but rather as a living organism where the verse of the week is intimately related to three other verses. König called this constellation of four interconnected verses a "cross". This fourfoldness reflects the working of the four archangels who are continuously present in the surroundings of the Earth.

As Richard explained during his talk, we should not be working with a singular verse each week but with four verses at a time! In this way, we connect ourselves to the activity of the archangels and to other people who are working with the Calendar of the Soul in different places on the Earth.

After his talk, Richard gave us a guided tour of the exhibition of Karl König's 52 original drawings. Each of them was accompanied by Richard's new English translation. The beautiful drawings, each barely the size of a book cover, are permeated by a childlike spirit and include many archetypal images. They also reflect Karl König's fine sense of humour.

Richard's talk and the viewing of the exhibition have deepened my relationship with the Calendar of the Soul and sparked my interest in new explorations in this realm. Many thanks to him and the organizers!

The exhibition is currently touring North America. There are plans to show it in Toronto in October. Please look out for further information here in the eNews or on the ASC website.

Experiencing these profound, urgent mysteries is the focus for the exhibitions of Karl König's drawings for the Calendar of the Soul that the Institute is bringing to North America.

The exhibition will feature talks and guided tours by Richard Steel. Hosts in local areas can augment the exhibition with local speakers and artistic presenters.

Exhibitions will connect with the series of 52 talks on the Calendar of the Soul and Karl König's drawings that Richard is giving, "An Inner Journey through the Year".

Olaf Lampson's Summary of His Address at the 2024 AGM

The title of my talk is Spiritual Research. It is not about my research as much as how we all, aware or not, might be involved in spiritual research. In his book The Mystery of St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist, (page 10,11) Sergei Prokofieff mentioned how Rudolf Steiner had responded to the question of a student how one could know that one had been doing spiritual research. Rudolf Steiner replied that if one had the experience during one's Anthroposophical work of being struck by a certain truth so that it remained alive in one's memory and some time later one was similarly impressed by an other truth



and that out of the coming together of the two, an insight had occurred to one, which derived from the substance of both, then one had been involved, to some extent in spiritual research. The formulation "involved to some extent" made me wonder, who is the researcher? Many of us may have had such an experience without having thought of ourselves as researchers.

What I wish to talk about are thoughts that have come together in this way. These thoughts had, in fact, to do with questions about spiritual research. In the early 1990s I had come across a lecture by Rudolf Steiner (Budapest June 4, 1909) in which he spoke about the law of universal spiritual brotherliness.

"If an appropriately trained clairvoyant has perceived something in the spiritual world at, say 1920, it would be impossible for another, equally trained individual, to access this at a later date, unless he/she had learned in the "ordinary way" about the research that has been done earlier by another. Relatively soon there will be many who become clairvoyant. They will only perceive what is soulless (wesenlos), not the truth in the spiritual

world, because they cannot see the important research that has gone before.... Thus, even the clairvoyant has to learn first what has already been researched and then, after conscientious training, can he see the facts for himself... On this law, a universal brotherliness is founded, a truly human brotherhood. The treasure of wisdom has been carried from culture to culture in the mystery schools, faithfully protected by the masters.... And we, too, have to help carry this treasure in brotherliness with those who have achieved something, if we wish to rise into the higher regions of the spiritual world....One can say that the spiritual world fertilizes a human soul only once, and when that has taken place it is necessary for others to be conscious of what another human soul has achieved before they can partake in it."

Two things stood out for me and remained in my memory: One, that unlike in our usual scientific research, it is not a question of rallying our reasoning powers to find answers, but of forming a relationship with spiritual beings to be granted revelation of their secrets. Two, the condition of heeding the law of universal spiritual brotherliness is part of forming such a relationship.

When I recently read the lecture given by Rudolf Steiner in Neuchatel, (Sept. 27,1911) concerning the work of Christian Rosenkreutz, the description of the twelve initiates around the thirteenth threw a new light on what I had learned from this Budapest lecture about the universal spiritual brotherhood.

For seven hundred years, from the beginning of the thirteenth to the end of the nineteenth century, the gates to the spiritual world had been closed: Not even initiates were able to receive spiritual revelations through clairvoyance. During that time twelve initiates gathered around a thirteenth. These twelve had been masters of ancient mystery schools during the seven Atlantean and the five post-Atlantean cultural epochs. Although they were unable to gain direct access to the spiritual world during that period, they were able to remember the wisdom which had been revealed to them during their previous lives and gather them and convey them to the thirteenth. This group of initiates formed a brotherhood which protected the treasure of cultural wisdom that had accumulated over the ages. The Spiritual world offered no new revelations, and the wisdom that had come to humanity had to be guarded from a developing human thinking that became increasingly unable to grasp spiritual thoughts. Then, at the end of the nineteenth century thinking had reached the point when it began to free itself from feeling and willing and humanity unconsciously approached the threshold and the possibility of a new clairvoyance.

The law of the universal spiritual brotherliness appears to me like a direct response to humanity approaching the threshold to the spiritual world. One might say humanity is knocking at the gate of the spiritual world and may even have the possibility of passing the guardian unprepared, and the spirits must answer. And so, we can say the gates are again open to the spiritual brotherhood of humanity, but they are closed to those who come disregarding it. I think that means that the treasure of wisdom guarded by the twelve has now also been handed over to the universal, spiritual brotherhood?

Since, however, humanity as a whole is unconsciously knocking, as it were, not only those who are initiates, this preparing for relationship with the spiritual world "in the ordinary way", on this side of the threshold, applies to all of us who have become aware of this threshold situation of humanity.

Rudolf Steiner makes this clear in the lecture Crossing the Threshold and the Social Organism (GA193). "We are just crossing the threshold of a significant portal.... this imposes duties upon us, the duty of shaping

external life in such a way that the great change which takes place in man's inner life must be experienced in his external life.....We must begin to turn to the new thoughts which are now beginning to be active..... Man should... be pervaded with the feeling that the things which he has arranged with his angel during the preceding night should become fruitful in the course of his day."


To cultivate this awareness of our duty, or responsibility toward our culture, to be pervaded by the feeling that what we have arranged with our angel should become fruitful during the course of our day, this is spiritual research on this side of the threshold. This is part of the Michael path. But there are two gestures to the Michael path. The one is a cognitive gesture of individual self development. The other points toward building community with the awareness of our duty to shape external life in harmony with the arrangement with our angel. It is to flow directly into our intentions. This is a will gesture.

Recently the name Vidar, in connection with a new spiritual path, was discussed in our study group. Having always been interested in the being of Vidar, I read up on the ancient legends of Michael and Vidar and compared them with what I could find in anthropomorphic literature.*

The following picture arose for me: In the ancient legends, both Michael and Vidar are heroes. Michael fights the dragon with sword to rescue the virgin, while Vidar fights the Fenris Wolf to avenge the death of his father Odin. Vidar is protected by a boot made of the bits of leather discarded by the world's shoe makers. From the esoteric background, as archangelic beings, both belong to the sphere of the Holy Sophia, and at the same time both are deeply connected with the being of Christ. Both have two sides: one directed toward individualizing, the other toward uniting, forming communities. Vidar, former guardian angel of the Gautama Bodhisattva, under the archangel Odin, fights the Fenris Wolf (Ahriman/ Lucifer) for dominance over the faculty of clairvoyance and of speech, which was Odin's domain before he withdrew to rise to a higher rank.

I see Vidar's boot as an image for the will forces on this side of the threshold that have to be rescued from Ahriman for the new clairvoyance of the consciousness soul. By permeating our selves with the feeling that what we have arranged with our angel should become fruitful during the day, we can rally our will. That means, that in addition to using our thinking for being able to function during the day, we pay attention to what, or who, moves us to these thoughts. While this is part of the training toward clairvoyance it leads us at the same time to building community and ordering karma because the will impulses behind our thoughts are always in the context of other human thinking and our angel. I like to call this the Vidar gesture of the Michael path.


