Manu Hall Eurythmy Fundraiser



Dear friends,

For 6 years now, Maison Emmanuel, modelled on the worldwide Camphill movement, has graciously provided our Interval eurythmy ensemble with a practise space for weekly and intensive rehearsals, as well as storage for all our costumes and equipment.

We're so grateful! Without this opportunity, we would not have been able to pursue the development of artistic eurythmy in Quebec, Canada and internationally.

However, our eurythmy work is currently taking place in the basement of Maison Cérès, one of Maison Emmanuel's large houses, which is also home for 6 adults in need of care and volunteer coworkers. The space is also used for Maison Emmanuel's eurythmy group and therapy, for the weekly Sunday service, occasional Christian Community Service, and for all of Maison Emmanuel's events and festival celebrations. The space is limited and was only ever intended as a temporary home for these activities therefore, Maison Emmanuel has a long-standing project to build a hall that can better serve the needs of all who use it. The aim is to have a large independent space that in addition to the current activities will offer the possibility of artistic presentations for an audience of around 80 people.



After many years of fund-raising, Maison Emmanuel is now very close to its goal and very much hopes that 2025 will mark the birth of the building under the tutelage of the being of Manu, named after him.

The architects plans propose a warm, welcoming space at the heart of Maison Emmanuel, at a discreet distance from the residential homes. Manu Hall will be a haven for human encounters, social, cultural, religious and artistic activities, and will be a rich contribution not only to Maison Emmanuel and the future of artistic and therapeutic eurythmy, but also to the entire surrounding community.







Val Willms OBITUARY

Valentine (Val) Paul Willms, teacher and lifelong student of Anthroposophy, passed away peacefully on June 3, 2024, in Vancouver, British Columbia, at the age of 88.

Val was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba, on Valentine's Day, February 14, 1936. Val had an aptitude for languages - Latin and French especially -- and taught them at secondary schools in Ontario, Alberta and BC. He was deeply influenced by his mother, Anna Fast -- a steadfast follower of Rudolph Steiner and a long time member of the Anthroposophical Society. Val joined the Anthroposophical Society in 1972 and remained a member until physical and cognitive decline resulted in his hospitalization in 2016 and move to a care home in 2017. Val embraced Steiner's teachings about the interconnectedness of spiritual and earthly life, the significance of personal responsibility, and the continuous evolution of the human soul towards higher spiritual realms. Val was predeceased by siblings, John Willms, Edgar Willems, and Vicki Brandt. He will be remembered by nephews, Jordon Brandt and Michael Brandt o f British Columbia, and nieces, Michele Delwiche and Sandra Halvorsen of Minnesota, USA. His intellect and spirit fed many lively conversations.

Val was cremated and his ashes were interred at the Glen Eden Memorial Gardens in Winnipeg, Manitoba, alongside the graves of his parents, per his request.



Responsibilities include willingness to collaborate with other teacher training institutes, handling inquiries, and performing a variety of office duties. The candidate will work with faculty, board members, and administration. The ideal candidate will have excellent communication skills and the ability to work independently and as part of a team. Program co-director will need to travel to British Columbia for the three training sessions: three weeks in July and one week each in November and February.

Rudolf Steiner School Mbagathi -An Update From Sarnia Guiton in Kenya

"I've never worked at a school before where the children cry when they have to leave for school holidays."

Words from a teacher at the Rudolf Steiner School Mbagathi in Nairobi, Kenya.

Incomprehensible? Not when those children will be leaving their loving boarding parents to go back to the slums, to someone who

doesn't want them, where they will be hungry most of the time and abused in all kinds of ways. They return to school malnourished, physically damaged and with fear in their eyes. It takes many days for their confidence to return, their tummies to really feel full, the bruises to disappear and, if anything worse has happened, medical attention and trauma therapy is needed. Something has to be done.

This is a rescue school that takes in destitute and impoverished children and depends on sponsors and concerned funders for their financial needs. Staying at school for these children is not an option. The government requires all boarding children go 'home' at holiday times, irrespective of whether there really is a home to go to.

A small group has formed to find a viable alternative. Two teachers and two concerned individuals are working towards a creating a Holiday Camp for these children, on the model of N. American Summer Camps. We need to provide for 45 to 50 children from aged 4 to 16, just over 10% of the children at the school. We have found a farm that provides a campsite and programs for children in a beautiful environment. We are exploring what the Kenya Forest Service (KFS) offers, where the children would be in nature with local wildlife around – not the predatory ones!

We already have 3 large tents and are researching the cost for 4 more. One of us is finding sleeping bags at Thrift Stores for \$10 each. The school already has a portable kitchen and school buses. The whole school is excited about this – teachers, boarding parents, administrative staff, gardeners, cooks, cleaners – everyone! Many are willing to give up some of their vacation time to be a part of it. Yet excitement and good will does not simultaneously allow school funds to be diverted to this project. The school calendar in Kenya goes from January to December; the long two-month holiday is November to December. We are hoping there will be a few Waldorf Seniors who might do their Community Service requirement here with the children, in the natural Kenya environment. The language is English; the basic tenets of the education are the same and the children, freed from the misery of their previous 'holidays', are happy, warm, respectful and delightful company.

We are gathering funds – donations from those who can feel this need in their souls. If you can help, a donation can be made to AWSNA in America and ASC in Canada, both earmarked for Rudolf Steiner School Mbagathi, for a tax-deductible receipt. Unfortunately, it is a slow process for these funds to arrive in Kenya; it can take many months, and we intend to have a Holiday Camp ready to go in November. If you are comfortable with a quicker method, checks/cheques can be sent to: Sarnia Guiton, P.O.
