Widely respected as an anthroposophical scientist, Gopi recently translated into English a critical book for the times written about a century ago: *The Spiritual Foundation of Numbers* by Ernst Bindel (German Title: Die geistigen Grundlagen der Zahlen)

As Gopi says, "It is a fantastic work that explores the moral quality of numbers as well as the importance of different numbers to different human capacities. It covers a breathtakingly wide range of topics - the Trinity, the Pentagram, the Ten Commandments, the witches' magic square puzzle in Faust, the mathematical riddle in the Chymical Wedding of Christian Rosenkreutz, the relation between plant growth and arithmetical operations, the Kabbalah, Gematria, deeper meanings of Seven, the Number 666 in the Apocalypse, the geometrical construction of the golden ratio. This 1935 book predates the New Age wave of the 60's, and as a result, it is refreshing to see the topics treated with no sensationalism but only systematic and thorough anthroposophic thought. And as a bonus, this volume also includes a brilliant exposition of the properties of the Periodic Table of Elements, where Bindel clearly shows how the Periodic Table is a document bearing testament to the cosmic history of the Earth. This part was a real joy to translate."

Pathfinding in Uncertainty—Cultivating Capacities for Leading into the Future Four-day intensive, October 15 - 19, 2025, Toronto, Ontario, Canada

Convened by John Bloom and Leah Walker

Leading and leadership for organizational mission has brought with it new personal, social, and economic challenges. Can you assume trust in relationships in such a polarized environment? What will it take to forge new agreements around values and organizational practices? The world reflects uncertainty, but you likely need inner certainty and clarity in order to lead.

This four-day intensive will develop capacities for self-knowledge as a foundation for leading and serving others in a time of uncertainty, distrust, and a willful by-passing of truth. Leading out of one's intuitive sense for the future, out of a mood of inquiry rather than outcome, brings one, regardless of experience or origin, to a threshold, a gateway to community. This recognition and how to navigate it lie at the heart of this intensive.

During the four days we will focus on the deep organizational and vocational questions each participant carries and is open to exploring. Biography work, how we form agreements, and work with the social field of groups are core to the processes we will explore together. How do we recognize how instrumental each of us is in making insight possible for others? How do we serve what wisdom wants to emerge from being together?

What We Will Do Together

- Practice creative group processes for deepening social understanding
- Engage in biography work to enhance one's own individuality and to develop capacity to
 perceive the individuality of others
- Cultivate reflective, meditative practices for oneself and across an organization
- Explore decision-making and leadership style through three perspectives: cultural, rights, and economic
- Address intergenerational leadership issues and constructive conditions for succession
- Understand what is newly needed in the field of social agreements, how they are co-created and managed as a path to organizational effectiveness in the world.

How We Will Work

This intensive includes significant content, yet our way of working together will happen largely through experiential, living processes. Every aspect will be an exploration of new ways of leadership, new ways of connecting inner experience and outer reality, and new ways of being and working in groups and community.

Who Will Come Together

The invitation goes to those carrying responsibilities within spiritually based organizations, and anyone who feels they would benefit from and could contribute to this level of engagement. The intention is for participation to be guided by interest and need. Space is limited to allow for working closely and deeply.

Building on several years of convenings, this gathering continues the initiative of members of the School for Spiritual Science (General Anthroposophical Section). At the core of this co-creation is the notion that individual destiny, in relation to an anthroposophical path and through the practical work, is best cultivated in community. We will come together to cultivate a greater living connection to the work of the School while fostering a vibrant, open, and evolving community of practice: **spiritual activity within a social field of engagement, reflection, and research.**

The following gives a sense of what is being striven for in this gathering:

Does Anthroposophy have a future? This question seems to have been very much alive for Rudolf Steiner in the weeks leading up to the Christmas Foundation Meeting. Was it this question that inspired his decision to inaugurate the esoteric work of the School for Spiritual Science? He knew that it was only through an esoteric deepening that new life could flow into the spiritual work and allow anthroposophical practice to bear fruit in the world. Can we, in our work together, birth impulses capable of bringing new vitality to the School for Spiritual Science in North America? What are the inner and outer gestures of a truly modern esoteric path?



Obituary: Phillip Walter Natiuk September 11, 1950 - November 23, 2024

And still, his destiny, karma brought him into that inner place of letting go of that which came between him and others between him and me between him and himSelf. Letting go of himself and keeping Self. The way of the pilgrim. The way of the Consciousness Soul - Be who You are.


This poem was written by his wife, Alice Natiuk. To tell you more about Phillip's life and death, three eulogies about him are linked to the ASC website.

The first one is written by Rev. Marc Fortin of the Christian Community who presided over Phillip's funeral. The funeral was held in the Roman Catholic Church in Manitoba where Phil grew up. The second eulogy is written by Phillip's cousin, Terry Ludwick. He was asked by Phillip to speak at the funeral reception 6 days before Phil died. This is about his youth.
