**Will speak on**

**The Process Through Which Evolution Reaches  
Toward Autonomy and Freedom**

Dr. Arie Bos was born in Delft in 1947. He studied medicine at Vrije University Amsterdam and has worked as a general practitioner of anthroposophically extended medicine from 1976 to 2012. During this time, he both taught general practice trainees at VU University Amsterdam and worked as the school doctor at the Waldorf school in Amsterdam. He is a member of the Medical Section of the School of Spiritual Science at the Goetheanum in Dornach, Switzerland.

Dr. Bos has written several books which have been well-received in the Netherlands. These books, written in Dutch, reflect his extensive work examining the connections between Rudolf Steiner's work and recent discoveries in contemporary science. His first book was published in 1987 about AIDS. His 2008 work in Dutch on human evolution and neuroscience, *Mind and Matter: The Evolution of the Self*, was chosen as one of the best popular science books in the Netherlands, thereby bringing Anthroposophy into the mainstream! This book will be available in English in May 2026 through Arie Van Ameringen's publishing house in Montreal, *Perceval*. Already available in English, *Inside the Brain Box, Why Humans are not Biological Computers* was published by Floris Books in 2017. It presents a lively, yet detailed picture of the brain and the organization of the self, made enjoyable by his witty conversational style. A shorter version, *Gebruik je Hersenen*, was written for adolescents.

Dr. Bos has recently co-authored with Dr. Majella van Maaren, a new book for physicians. It is one of a series of handbooks called *Bolk's Companions*, published out of the Netherlands by a group of Dutch physicians. It contains a more detailed and technical exposition of the specific anomalous, verified neuroscience findings in current scientific literature that dispute the generally accepted medical conclusion that the brain generates consciousness and that the notion of "free will" is illusory. He leads the reader through a careful method of proper conceptual thinking that provides the necessary tool for seeing the data clearly. This book, *Consciousness, the Brain, and Free Will: a Phenomenological Perspective* can be viewed for free from Sichting Kingfisher Foundation.
